REAP Helps Single Father Regain Stability

Mr. L., a single father of three children, lost his job due to an illness. Unable to cover rent, he turned to REAP for help to keep his family in their home after exhausting other available support.

REAP provided funding to pay the past due rent. Staff also helped Mr. L complete and submit applications for SNAP benefits and assistance with energy payments, meaning Mr. L didn't have to worry about putting food on the table or keeping the lights on while he looked for a new job. REAP staff followed up with Mr. L after 90 days and learned that he had found employment and was able to cover his monthly costs.


These dinners are part of our renewed commitment to better connect with current supporters and reconnect with past supporters.
